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What is DSP?

The Data Standardization Project (DSP) is a statewide effort to collect standard child care data. R&R agencies worked together to choose both provider and client data elements to collect and report to the Network every two years.

- All active, licensed centers and family child care home providers who <u>do not</u> receive referrals from your R&R (Non-Referral providers)
- All active, license-exempt, center-based programs



Type of Care: Active, Licensed Center

Active, licensed child care centers

- DSP tracks all active child care centers with a day care license from Community Care Licensing.
 - Private, for-profit and non-profit centers;
 - Head Start centers;
 - CDE-contracted centers with full-time and/or part-time programs; and
 - Licensed centers that define themselves as co-ops, nursery schools, preschools and school age programs.

 - 21st Century Community Learning Centers
 - After-School Education and Safety Programs (ASES)
 - Boys and Girls Clubs
 - License-exempt YMCA programs
 - License-exempt Park and Recreation programs
 - License-exempt programs run through the city/town
 - Other license-exempt private, for- and non-profit fee based programs

Type of Care: Active Providers

- Currently serving children;
- Willing to care for children, even if they do not have children currently enrolled;
- On probation but still serving children;
- Taking a vacation or break when you conduct your updates, but will be caring for children at some time during the next calendar year;
- Closed when you conduct your update, but will be caring for children during next calendar year (Ex: migrant child care programs or centers operating during ski season).

These providers may or may not be receiving referrals from your agency.



Type of Care: Non-Referral Providers

- Providers that are licensed and active but do not want referrals from your R&R agency.
- For these providers, collect at a minimum:
 - Provider name
 - Location street address
 - Location city
 - Location zip code
 - Location county
 - Referral phone number
 - Licensed capacity

Collect and report all *active, licensed* homes and centers *even if they are not currently accepting referrals* from your R&R program.





Before we move on

1 Center = 1 Facility = 1 Record

- A child care center is defined as one physical site that has one or more licenses from CCL. Each child care center should have one database record.
- If a child care center is licensed to serve more than one age group, then the multiple license information is recorded within the provider's database record.
- If a group of child care centers are administered by a single agency, such as the YMCA, each center or site should have its own record.



Before we move on (cont.)

Exception to 1 Center = 1 Record Rule

- Please create two records if the center has a licenseexempt, school-age program in addition to a licensed infant and/or preschool program.
- If you create two records in the following cases, the Network will combine these records for DSP.
 - A center with distinct school-year and summer programs; and
 - A center with a full-day, General Child Care Program and a part-day State Preschool or Head Start program.
 - A facility with two licenses for different age groups



Before we move on (cont.)

1 Family Child Care Home = **1** Record

 Information for each active family child care home with a license from Community Care Licensing should be recorded within one database record.

3. Location: Address, City and Zip Code

The location information is where the child care actually takes place.

- We use the location information to describe where child care services are available for the families in your county.
- For that reason, this information should not be a mailing address or the address of an administrative office!



Location: Address, City and Zip Code

A note about center and home street addresses.

- If you only have a P.O. Box for the street address, please use cross-streets instead of the P.O. Box.
- Street addresses allow us to analyze and display the child care supply in a variety of ways, such as by census tract or school district.
- Street addresses allow us to produce pin-point maps of the child care centers in your county, with your approval.
- Street addresses make it easier for the Network to check for duplicates.

5. Licensed Capacity

Child Care Center Capacity

 Licensed capacity for a child care center is the maximum number of children, within a particular age group, that a provider can legally care for, according to the provider's license.

• The age groups are:

- Infants: 0-23 months
- Preschool: 2 to 5 years, 11 months
- School-age: 6 years or older

Family Child Care Home Capacity

- The licensed capacity for a small family child care home is eight children.
- The licensed capacity for a large family child care home is 14 children.

*Do not track desired capacity here, stay consistent with Community Care Licensing



Licensed Capacity:

Toddler and School-age Options:

Some preschool licenses for child care centers have a toddler and/or school-age option, which allow the provider to fill a specified number of preschool spaces with either toddlers or school age children.

For DSP Purposes:

- The preschool capacity should be recorded as the original preschool capacity on the license.
- The number of toddlers or school-age children allowed in the options should not be deducted from the preschool capacity.
- The number of toddlers or school-age children allowed should not be added to the infant or school age capacity.



Licensed Capacity

Example:

A center has a preschool license for 25 with a toddler option of 5.

- Please enter "25" in the preschool capacity field.
- Do not add "5" to the preschool capacity field.

6. Desired Capacity

Desired capacity is for Family Child Care Homes only.

- Desired capacity is the number of children the family child care provider chooses to serve <u>at any one time</u>.
- A family child care home provider could choose to serve as many children as they are allowed (their licensed capacity) or fewer children (their desired capacity).
- We are collecting this information to get a more accurate picture of the true family child care home supply available for parents.

Remember, the desired capacity could be equal to or less than the licensed capacity, but never more than the licensed capacity.


Desired Capacity

Example:

A family child care provider is licensed to care for 8 children. However, she never serves more than 3 children at one time.

- Licensed capacity = 8
- Desired capacity = 3

7. Full-Time or Part-Time Care

Full-time and part-time care are defined by the schedules available to the children. It does not refer to how many hours the facility is open for business.

Full-time care = 30 hours or more per week

Part-time care = less than 30 hours per week

Full-Time or Part-Time Care

Example

A Head Start program is open from 8:00 AM to 5:00 PM (45 hours per week) but only offers three-hour sessions for the children each day (15 hours per week). This Head Start provider offers part-time care only.

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8. Year Schedule of Care Available

- Full year Care is available 12 months a year, including when school is in session, during the summer, and offtrack for year round schools. The provider may or may not be open during holidays and vacations.
- School year only Care is available ONLY when school is in session, not during off-track months or summer vacations.
- Summer only Care is available ONLY during the summer when school is not in session. The provider may or may not be open during summer holidays.

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9. Other Schedules of Care Available

Day Schedules:

- Drop-in Care available on an occasional or on-call basis.
- Evening Care available after 7PM and before 10PM, and the child does not spend the night.
- Overnight Care available overnight, available after 10PM and before 6AM the following day
- **Before school** Care available for school-age children (including kindergarteners) before school starts in the morning.
- After school Care available for school-age children (including kindergarteners) after school ends in the afternoon.

Other Schedules of Care Available

Week Schedules:

- Rotating schedule Care available for a variable weekly or monthly schedule that corresponds with a parent's work schedule.
- Weekends Care available on Saturdays or Sundays.

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10. Subsidized Providers

 A subsidized provider has a direct contract with a public funding source to fund permanent child care spaces at the center or family child care home.

The four subsidy types are:

- Head Start
- CDE: State Preschool
- CDE: All but State Preschool
- Other Public Contract

Remember, subsidized providers are not defined as those who are reimbursed through voucher programs, such as the AP Program. Please do not use "CDE Contract" or "Other Public Contract".



Subsidized Providers

CDE: State Preschool

 Center has a contract with the CDE for a California State Preschool program, a part-day/full-day comprehensive developmental program for three to five year old children from low-income families.

CDE: All but State Preschool

 Center or home has a direct contract with CDE for spaces at the facility for General, Migrant, Campus, ASES, 21st CCLC, and Severely Handicapped Child Care Programs.

Head Start

Center or home has a Head Start or Early Head Start contract

Other public contract

 Center or home has a direct contract with a town, city or county government to fund permanent spaces at the center/home. Many counties do not have centers with other public contracts.

11. Languages Spoken by the Provider

DSP tracks the languages spoken by the staff at the child care center or family child care home when caring for children.

- DSP tracks the six most frequently spoken languages in California and other additional languages:
 - English
 - Spanish
 - Chinese
 - Tagalog
 - Korean
 - Vietnamese
 - Other



Languages Spoken by the Provider

- Many agencies track additional languages spoken by providers. R&Rs can track as many additional languages as necessary.
- MCCP has a list of 19 languages
- If all your providers speak English, check "English".
 Otherwise, the Network will not know what language the provider speaks.

12. Child Care Food Program

- DSP is tracking if a provider is participating in the Child Care Food Program (CCFP), which is a state and federally-funded program that gives financial aid to licensed centers and homes for nutritious meals for children.
- The CCFP is administered on the state level by the California Department of Education. On the local level, the program is administered by a variety of agencies. As long as the provider is participating in the CCFP, it does not matter which local agency the provider contracts with for the CCFP.

Section 2: Client Data Elements



Before We Get Started

- <u>Definition of a CLIENT</u> someone who is requesting a child care referral. The client could call you on the phone, drop-in to your R&R, or request a referral online.
- Every request for a child care referral, even if the parent has called before, should have its own database record.
- Because of the large number of referrals conducted by the R&Rs during the year, the Network only collects client data for the April, May, June quarter. We then estimate the total number of referrals, parents served, and children served for the entire year.

Before We Get Started

A Note about Web-Based Referrals

- Many R&Rs conduct online referrals. The DSP project needs to track the DSP information for each referral made online or we will seriously underestimate our referrals and the number of parents and children served.
- Your web-based referral form should include every DSP client data element with a definition for each field.
- The goal is to collect as much of the DSP client data from web-based referrals as we can.

1. Age When Care is Needed (by child)

We track the exact age, in years and months, the child will be when care is needed.

3. Special Needs (by child)

DSP tracks requests for special needs care. Special needs is defined according to the Americans with Disabilities Act (ADA).

- A special needs child is one whose physical or mental impairment substantially limits that child, to the degree that it is age appropriate, from caring for her or himself, from performing manual tasks, or from any other "major life activity," such as walking, seeing, hearing, speaking, breathing, or learning.
- The R&R Network Data and Technology Committee has developed special needs categories matrix.



Special Needs Matrix

Behavioral/Emotional Psychological: ADD/ADHD, Overly Aggressive, Bipolar
Special Health/Medical Needs: Asthma, HIV, Severe Allergies
Communication/Language: Speech/Language Delays, Stuttering, Cleft Palate
Physical Disability: Cerebral Palsy, Muscular Dystrophy, Epilepsy
Visual/Hearing: Blind, Deaf, Hearing impaired, Visually impaired
Developmental Delays (cognitive, physical, communication, social, emotional, adaptive): Difficulty in learning to walk, climb, or play

5. Full-time or Part-time Care Requested (by child)

6. Year Schedule of Care Requested (by child)

- Full year Care is requested for 12 months a year, including when school is in session, during the summer, and off-track for year round schools. The care may or may not be requested during holidays and vacations.
- School year only Care is requested <u>ONLY</u> when school is in session, not during off-track months or summer vacations.
- Summer only Care is requested <u>ONLY</u> during the summer when school is not in session. The care may or may not be requested during summer holidays.

7. Other Schedules of Care Requested (by child)

Day Schedules:

- Drop-in Care needed on an occasional or on-call basis.
- Evening Care needed after 7PM and before 10PM, and the child does not need to spend the night.
- Overnight Care needed overnight at the provider's house or the child care center. Care needed after 10PM and before 6AM the following morning
- Before school Care needed for school-age children (including kindergartners) before school starts in the morning.
- After school Care needed for school-age children (including kindergartners) after school is over in the afternoon.



Other Schedules of Care Requested

Week Schedules:

- Rotating schedule Care requested for a variable weekly or monthly schedule that corresponds with a parent's work schedule.
- Weekends Care requested on Saturdays or Sundays.

9. Reason Care is Needed (by client)

Employment - The client needs care for their children while they are working.

In school/training - The client needs care for their children while they are in school or in a training program.

Enrichment and development - The client is available to care for the child, but wants the child to attend child care for the child's enrichment and development.

Other parental needs - The client is not available to care for the child for reasons other than employment or school/training.



Reason Care is Needed (cont.)

Looking for work - The client needs care for their children while they are looking for work.

Alternate/back up care - The client needs back up care because his/her regular child care arrangement is unavailable.

Child Protective Services or respite referral - The client is referred by CPS or by another professional for child care.

Mildly ill child - The client needs child care for a mildly ill child who cannot attend school or his/her usual child care arrangement.
