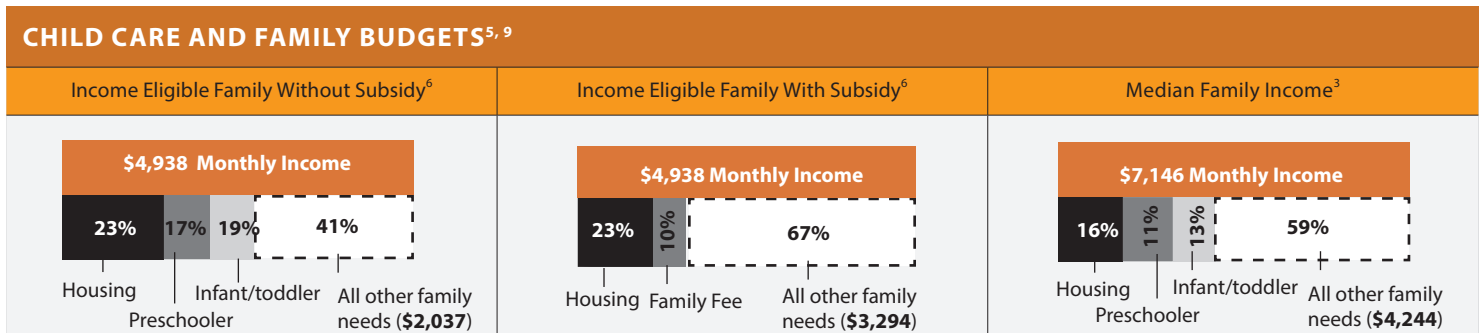
## Family & Child Data
