

## CHILD CARE INITIATIVE PROJECT (CCIP) FY 22-23

CCIP places an emphasis on recruiting, supporting, and providing professional growth opportunities to potential and existing home-based child care providers (licensed and exempt), with a focus on those who care for infants and toddlers and children whose families receive child care subsidies. CCIP began in 1985, and since 2002 has been

> implemented by child care resource and referral programs (R&Rs) across CA in all 58 counties.











## CAPACITY BUILDING

FY 2022-2023 saw CCIP participants become licensed Family Child Care Home providers, expand their existing services, and re-open closed programs.
