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California Child Care Resource & Referral



What is the Child Care Portfolio?

Since 1997, the California Child Care Resource & Referral Network has produced the biennial California Child Care Portfolio. This report presents a unique portrait of child care supply, demand, and cost statewide and county-by-county, as well as information on populations, poverty, and family budgets.

Data Collection

- Child Care Data: Licensed Child Care Supply and Request Data
 - Collected from California Child Care Resource and Referral (CCR&R) Agencies
 - Supply: Spring 2023 at one point in time
 - Requests: 3-month snapshot between April 1, 2023
 – June
 30, 2023
- Child and Family Data: Population, Poverty, and Family Budgets
 - Supplemental data sources such as the American
 Community Survey (ACS), Economic Policy Institute (EPI),
 KidsData.org, Department of Finance (DOF), and the
 National Database of Child Care Prices

R&Rs make up a well-developed system that supports families, child care providers, and local communities with child care information and resources.



Licensed Center Infant Capacity






Change in Licensed Family Child Care Home Supply 2021-23






Voucher Use by Setting - October 2023




Change in Licensed Child Care Supply by Region (2021-2023)

Percent Change in All Licensed Spaces (2021-2023)




Percent Change in Licensed FCC Spaces (2021-2023)



Percent Change in Licensed Center Spaces (2021-2023)




Family Budget (Monthly)






Family Budget (Monthly)

A Parent's Story

"I started searching in my city San Ramon and found out my child care voucher for subsidy did not cover the cost. I would have to pay \$300 a week out of pocket and I can't afford it, that's why I have a subsidy voucher.

So next step I searched for a child care center near my parents house and found a center but was put on a waitlist for my 2 year old daughter's school in October 2024. Finally my daughter was given an opportunity to attend child care and learn...even though I still had to pay a weekly fee of \$29.33.

So all that to say, even though I had a subsidy voucher, I still had a hard time finding and affording child care near my home for my 2 year old daughter." - Parent from Contra Costa County

Data Recap

- Licensed child care in California increased. However, licensed care is still only available to 26% of children with working parents.
- There is substantial regional and county variation in the changes in supply.

Data Recap

- Center-based infant capacity experienced the largest year over year increase seen since the Portfolio's inception, an increase of 6,552 compared to 2021.
- While FCC spaces increased, they are far from the prerecession levels.
 - More than two-thirds of voucher enrollments were in FFN (32.8%) and FCC (41.9%) care settings
- Child care costs make up a large proportion of many families' budgets

Policy Priorities

Providers

- Fair Provider Pay
 - Rate reform
 - Enrollment based subsidy payments
- Protect State and Federal Investments in Child Care

Policy Priorities

Families

- Equitable Child Care Access
 - Growth and stabilization of child care programs
 - Universal child care that includes the mixeddelivery child care system
 - Further research to understand the impact of Transitional Kindergarten implementation.
