A. Next Level Culture, Feedback & Leadership - California Salon 1

- 2. Demystify Regulations like CCPA and clarify if and how Cal-Secure applies to state-funded nonprofit contractors.
- 3. Empower Action by providing best practices and state-aligned tools for implementing cybersecurity protections, even with limited resources.

You will walk away with tips about requesting provider updates, reviewing data for accuracy, and using this data to inform your organization's work.

Q. Power of Partnership: Building a Pathway to Inclusion for Black Families in Child Care - Maxi's

When child care agencies build connections with Black-led organizations locally and statewide, they are able to share these resources with child care providers who work with Black families. This partnership creates a superpower between the agencies, the providers, and the families. Black-led programs are programs designed by and for the Black community and their unique needs. When resources around these needs are promoted by mainstream child care agencies, they are not just 'shared' resources but 'shared' power. Inclusion begins with partnerships, and its power changes everything. Partnerships can turn equity from policy into practice and by child care agencies building these partnerships with Black-led programs, equity is also turned into ACTION!

R. R&R New Fiscal Plan Requirement- California Salon 4
