


Median Family Income

Closure to Supply Ratio

Summary: While overall there doesn't appear to be a between a county's income and their proportion of family child care providers who have closed (page 2), the maps show that the north and central valley regions of the state, which have lower median incomes, also experienced a greater proportion of family child care providers closing in 2021.





As the color darkens, median income increases (left), and the proportion of licensed centers and family child care homes who have permanently closed increases (right).


