Public Policy Agenda Priorities

The Network supports quality child care options for all families that are accessible, affordable, and equitable. We urge our policy makers to:

- Pass a budget that prioritizes quality, accessible child care for all children, especially infants and toddlers
- Protect and strengthen the child care delivery system so that every parent trying to provide for their family has the ability to do so, and every child care provider is adequately compensated for the care they deliver
- Prioritize policies that help ensure all parents have the resources they need to care for their families

Jan 25 – Last day to submit bill requests to the Office of Legislative Counsel.

Feb 22 – Last day for bills to be introduced.

Apr 22 – Legislature reconvenes from Spring Recess.

Apr 26 – Last day for *policy committees* to hear and report to fiscal committees fiscal bills introduced in their house.

May 3 – Last day for *policy committees* to hear and report to the floor non-fiscal bills introduced in their house.

May 31 – Last day for each house to pass bills introduced in that house.

September 13 – Last day for *each house* to pass bills, except bill that take effect immediately or bills in Extraordinary Session.

October 13 – Last day for Governor to sign or veto any bills passed by the Legislature on or before September 13th and in the Governor's possession on or after September 13th.
