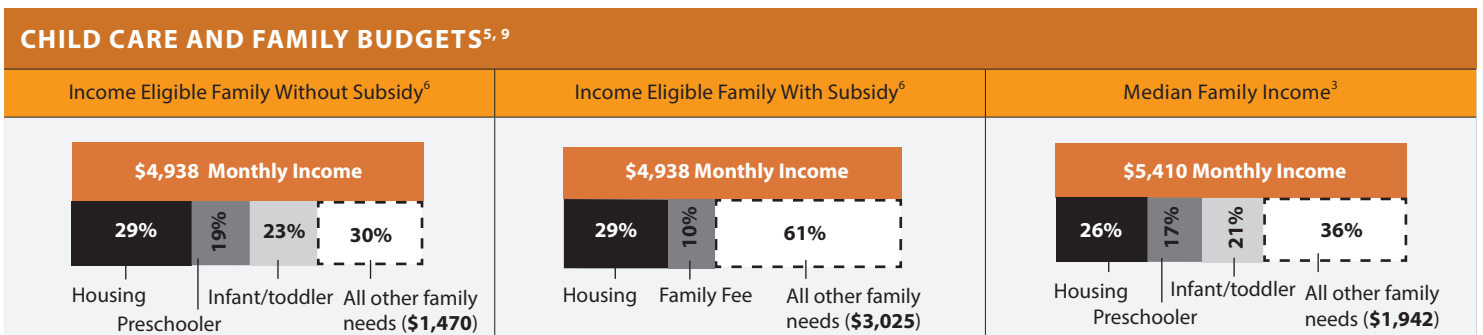

R&Rs work daily to help parents find child care that best suits their family and economic needs.
