






## **Availability of Licensed Spaces for Children 0-12**


#### Children 0-12 in California




## **Supply Change by Region, 2017-2019**




## **Licensed Family Child Care Homes 1996-2019**




# Percent change in family child care homes, base year 2008





## Percentage of vouchers used in each setting






# Nontraditional Hours Study: Parent satisfaction with provider









## Parent satisfaction with family child care provider








## **Parent Voices - Waiting for Change**


"I'm about to be homeless because I can't pay any of the bills this month including my rent because I haven't been able to work fully because of child care."


"I'm on the verge of [losing] everything because I cannot get the assistance needed. The system is backwards. Why do we have to lose everything before getting the help we need?"
